Antisocial Behaviour issues.

Very sadly there has been a spate of antisocial behaviour escalation, unfortunately in the process of supporting some residents I became a target. As I hope you will agree, this is totally not acceptable. All of the antisocial behaviour has been unacceptable and after insisting on action and following meetings with officers I am pleased a plan has been put together. As I have been assisting residents with these issues, what has come to light is the way it's being reported. It appears that the messages just are not reaching the correct teams.

So, too that end I arranged for set areas with issues to receive flyers with copies of the contact information listed below. Its important if residents are reporting it via 101 (either online or phone) that they copy the antisocial team in as well as they link in with our local police team and also housing. Feel free to copy me in as well so I can help follow up, as many residents have done with good success.(fisaacs@winchester.gov.uk)

Community safety street surgery - I facilitated the on-street brief which included our local Police officers, Neighbourhood services officers and Community Safety Officers from WCC on the 19th October where residents got the opportunity to meet members of the team and raise any concerns. This was highly popular and another one is planned in the new year.

Supporting residents with noise from the glass recycling - For many months I have been assisting residents with the noise issues from the station road Glass recycling centre in Alresford. This is the only site that is open 24hrs 7days a week and was moved next to a residential building. Support on this issue was also given by New Alresford Town Council when both residents and myself presented the information. I have since received a formal request from NATC on relocating this site and I am currently liaising with WCC officers regarding this .

Bishop's Sutton Footpath update - Planned breaking ground of phase 1 of the footpath enhancement is still anticipated sometime October/November. I am following up with lead officers with regards to this.

Proposed carpark 1-3 The Dean, Alresford. - After there were conflicting rumours about possible issues I asked for clarification from the lead planning officer. He confirmed that although there had been an independent review of the plans, the planning officers continue to liaise with the developers and an anticipated submission is expected soon. If

this doesn't need to go to a planning committee for a decision then the expected timelines on this are 8 weeks for a decision, otherwise about 3 moths for a committee outcome. With the contract option running out in October 2024 it's obviously of concern that this is approved before then for fear of complete collapse.

No On-Street Parking Charges - After it was announced that Hampshire County Council would be taking over the on street car parking from Winchester City Council as of 1st October , including enforcement, I took the lead portfolio holder, Cllr Nick Adams-King ,around the area highlighting the local issues including the impact on parking in our Town and the need for flexible on-street parking to support our fantastic businesses. Cllr Nick Adams-King confirmed that Hampshire County Council has no plans to place on-street charges in Alresford. A massive relief to businesses in light of what Winchester businesses are now struggling with as WCC have introduced overnight car parking charges along with the increase from free Sunday parking to £17 for over 4hrs. This has had a massive detrimental impact to Winchester businesses so this is welcome news in Alresford.
